## YOUR COUNCIL NEEDS YOU



I have been a Wembdon Parish Councillor for about a year now. Initially I was unsure about applying to be a Councillor as I thought that I didn't know enough about the role and hey, what do they do anyway! Support and encouragement from friends and people in the village eventually got me applying.

So, what has happened over the last year and was it worth it?

I have learned so much about the village community – that alone has made the effort worthwhile (I have lived here for over 20 years). The village doesn't run itself and the bigger area councils, Councillors, politicians etc. are not necessarily interested in Wembdon and its specific needs – we need to speak up for ourselves! To help me in my role there have been lots of support and training opportunities and the more seasoned Councillors on the team have offered an abundance of support and knowledge.

Firstly, Councillors are unpaid officials. We speak for Wembdon on your behalf and we do it because we love our village and surrounding area. My fellow Councillors (and Sam our Parish Clerk) have experience across a wide area of subjects, which means that I am always learning something new about things that could affect our village. This could be road speeds, potholes, pathways, planning, tree safety, our parks, the children's play area, conservation, the allotments, encouraging a caring and sharing neighborhood, managing and emptying bins, providing and maintaining defibrillators, parking issues, hand delivering this Parish Paper to every house – I could go on to fill this magazine but hopefully you get the idea.

A Parish Council can only truly represent its residents when it includes people from a range of backgrounds and experiences, so that the views and needs of the whole community are better understood.

Are you the right person to fill the vacancy of Councillor number 10?

Some of the things that Wembdon Parish Council has achieved over the last year include;

Input to planning applications (we don't decide the outcomes, but the Council can influence decisions). We try to represent the best interests of the village.

We actively deter activities such as vandalism by considering some of the causes. We have quickly reacted to vandalism by removing the visual impact and so preventing copycat activities. (Paint in the children's park)

We have an amazing environmentally friendly park recognised across a wider area. Oh, the fruit and nut trees are for wildlife use - please don't steal their food!

The allotments and Wembdon common areas are managed by us, which include lanes, paths, trees and hedges etc. that the village owns and we liaise with other councils for areas that the village doesn't own (some areas are owned by Somerset Council).

Many of the lights around our paths are monitored and maintained by us.

We are the voice that helps to get pavements and potholes fixed (often not to the standard that we would like so we persevere for a better result), but we need you to report them too. There is a link on our website.

We talk to our neighbouring Councils about common / shared issues, such as flooding, Hinkley Point and Highways.

We maintain a website to share information in Wembdon including meeting agendas and minutes, finance, events, road closures etc.

If you want to know more then please join us and observe our regular monthly Council meeting on the second Monday or contact a Councillor.

Oh, on the question of whether the effort to become a Wembdon Parish Councillor has been worth it.

**Yes, it has.**

Hello, I'm Amanda Mills Jones and I'm really pleased to have joined the Parish Council. I've lived in Wembdon for over 25 years, so this place means a great deal to me. I value the strong sense of history - particularly the buildings, and our green spaces, which includes spending time on my allotment. # Wembdon Parklands Update

## Protecting a Space for Wildlife

As work continues across Wembdon Parklands, local efforts remain focused on making the area a welcoming place for both residents and wildlife.

Improving foraging opportunities has been a key part of the project. Earlier this year, nine hazelnut trees, one walnut tree, one pear tree and one Golden Hornet crab apple tree were planted. These join the seven fruit trees already established in the Prairie Orchard in 2019, helping to provide a valuable food source for birds and other animals throughout the seasons.



What many people may not realise is that the land is

protected by a legal covenant to support local badgers and their foraging habitat. Badgers have been part of Wembdon for many years, and some residents will already be familiar with their regular visits to nearby gardens in search of food.

Unfortunately, in recent years some of the trees have been stripped of fruit and nuts overnight. While this may seem minor, it has a real impact on the wildlife that depends on these food sources. For that reason, members of the public are asked not to remove fruit or nuts from any of the trees or bushes within Wembdon Parklands. CCTV is in place and the situation will continue to be monitored.

## Allotment News



A new growing season is well on its way. The allotment landscape is changing; everything is growing like crazy. It's all go to keep on top of it all. After a very wet winter there has been a good few weeks of dry and sunny weather to be able to prepare seed beds and get planting. The blossom has been lovely this spring and it's good to see the birds and bees out there enjoying it too. The allotments are a pesticide and herbicide free zone. Allotment holders are keen to garden organically not to harm wildlife but to encourage it. It's evident in the number of bees, butterflies, birds, slow worms, lizards there are around. Most people grow flowers to encourage the insects not only to pollinate but as predators for aphids. There have been a lot of ladybirds around this spring.

Sadly, the recent strong winds brought down an old apple tree, happily there was no further damage anywhere else. The tree will be removed by the Parish Council's contractor.

Allotment holders have taken advantage of a few loads of wood chippings brought from tree work at the Parklands to make and repair paths on their plots.

The waiting list for an Allotment is very short. It's a good time for getting your name down if you are interested. Wembdon Parishioners take priority on the list over those who live outside of the boundary.

# SID & SPEEDWATCH REPORT MAY 2026

The Speedwatch Team met in April and the following data was recorded:-  
78 vehicles monitored within 1 hour. 13 vehicles were recorded over 25mph. **Highest speed was 47mph.**

The mobile SID is in position at the junction of Moore's Lane and Skimmerton Lane monitoring traffic incoming towards Wembdon.

## FIXED SOLAR SIDs

Generally vehicle speeds over the last 6 months have remained relatively constant. **There is still a worrying factor regarding MAXIMUM SPEEDS recorded, which is of great concern. SPEED KILLS.**

## Community Survey Report

You may have seen posters around the village or spotted the survey in the previous Parish Paper. We invited residents to take part in a survey so that we could better understand how people use Wembdon's current facilities and what new developments you would like to see. The responses have been analysed, and produced some interesting results. The survey was launched at this time because CIL funding has become available. Wembdon already has some CIL money, with more on the way.

CIL stands for Community Infrastructure Levy and is a charge that ensures new developments contribute to the infrastructure they depend on, and for Wembdon the main source of upcoming funding will be the Cokerhurst Farm development.

There were 177 responses, with some positive suggestions. When asked what facilities people used already, Cricket, the Green and Parish Centre coffee shops, the play area and football were mentioned most. When asked for reasons that people didn't use any of the facilities already available, one of the main reasons cited was that people were not aware of what was available already, and this is something that we will try and address by improving information put on the Parish web site and in the Parish Paper.

When asked what new facilities or improvements people would like to see, racket sports topped the list, in particular tennis and padel. There was also significant support for a Multi-Use Games Area. Community and social activities also featured strongly, with residents calling for clubs, social groups and activities for older people. Playground feedback highlighted demand for more challenging equipment. There were concerns raised about accessibility with residents citing uneven footpaths, blocked dropped kerbs, parking issues and poor lighting.

So, thank you to those who completed the survey. It was helpful, and we will update you in future Parish Papers of what progress and plans are being made for the future.

## Community Information

One of the issues that was highlighted from the Parish Survey was the need for better communication, people being unaware of some of the activities available and going on in the village. Many of the community groups, such as the Parish Centre and Wembdon Community Association advertise one-off events in the Parish Paper, but some also have their own websites detailing regular events that they run. Details, along with contact information can be found on their websites and social media pages.

St George's Parish Centre, Wembdon have a list of all the Community Groups who use their rooms on their website and provide details of their social gatherings and events.

Wembdon Village Hall at The Green also have a list of all the classes and facilities that they have on offer.

If you are interested in cricket, then Wembdon Cricket club post details of their games and social events on their Facebook page.

Wembdon Community Association also have a Facebook page where updates on their events are posted. Did you know that they hold a regular quiz night at the Parish Centre for example?

**Reporting problems on our roads and footpaths:** Did you know that the Parish Council are not responsible for maintaining pavements and streetlights or roads? We have all seen the alarming number of potholes this year for example. Somerset Council have a [Report a problem on the road](#) web page, which details how to raise a concern. Somerset Council also have a [Public Rights of Way](#) page, where you can download a map to show where they are located, and learn all about the improvement plan in place, as well as report an issue if you see one.


